AmeriCorps Massachusetts Promise Fellows deliver the resources young people need to be successful in life by creating, managing, and leading meaningful out-of-school time programs for youth in grades 6-12. Fellow projects focus on mentoring, social and emotional learning, college and career readiness, academic enrichment, and community service-learning.

The Massachusetts Promise Fellowship achieves this by placing AmeriCorps Fellows with schools, non-profit organizations and state/local government agencies that focus on fulfilling the needs of our youth by providing: *a caring adult, a safe place, a healthy start, a marketable skill, and an opportunity to give back.*

SERVICE DESCRIPTION

FALL RIVER- The Greater Fall River Re-Creation Committee, Inc. provides year-round recreational, educational, and cultural programs for Fall River residents with a particular emphasis on socioeconomically disadvantaged youth. The Fellow's primary responsibility will be to work with RE-CREATION'S Outreach program. This program identifies 20-30 high-risk out-of-school youth in Fall River that have any type of gang affiliation and/or gang activity. The Fellow will provide opportunities for youth to participate in service-learning projects as well as implement a program that provides maximum educational tools for the youth to stay engaged and succeed in school.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Coordinate with the educational leader in the HiSET (High School Equivalency Test) program and be present for programming four mornings per week
- Implement a supplementary educational program to help youth better understand the subjects necessary to pass the HiSET program (i.e. Math, Science, English, Social Studies and Reading Comprehension)
- Provide opportunities for HiSET youth to engage in service-learning projects with various community organizations
- Support the Youth Leadership Council (YLC), which is comprised of student leaders from several high schools who are actively working to solve youth-related issues related to education, environment, health and youth violence prevention
- Lead one or more Promise Leaders of Tomorrow (PLOT) program per week, where they will implement academic enrichment activities as well as develop programming that targets school-specific needs
- Coordinate quarterly community service projects which bring youth from HiSET, YLC, and PLOT together to make improvements in the community.
- Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training throughout the Commonwealth
- Make a full-time, 12-month commitment
