

# QUINCY ASIAN RESOURCES, INC. (QARI) AMERICORPS MASSACHUSETTS PROMISE FELLOW/SERVICECORPS FELLOW

AmeriCorps Massachusetts Promise Fellows deliver the resources young people need to be successful in life by creating, managing, and leading meaningful out-of-school time programs for youth in grades 6-12. Fellow projects focus on mentoring, social and emotional learning, college and career readiness, academic enrichment, and community service-learning.

**The Massachusetts Promise Fellowship** achieves this by placing AmeriCorps Fellows with schools, non-profit organizations and state/local government agencies that focus on fulfilling the needs of our youth by providing: a caring adult, a safe place, a healthy start, a marketable skill, and an opportunity to give back.

**SERVICE DESCRIPTION** Established in 2011, the Youth ServiceCorps' (YSC) mission aligns with QARI's mission to "foster and improve the social, cultural, economic and civic lives of Asian Americans" with a focus on Asian high school youth in Quincy, Braintree and surrounding communities. The Fellow will work closely with the 10 to 12 Youth Board members and up to 20 Youth Representatives, developing and implementing a curriculum of service learning projects to make a strong, significant, and lasting impact on the community and over 300 YSC members. These youth will plan, coordinate, and execute a series of small community service projects around Greater Boston, as well as some larger community projects, including a year-end celebration, a career day, and fundraising events. The Fellow will be serving a consistent group of 22 to 36 youth, for 35 hours a week, with approximately 20 of those hours being direct time with youth. The Fellow will lead the development and implementation of a college access curriculum.

## **ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES**

- > Supervise and support Youth Board's completion of goals and implement projects by discussing and assessing community needs
- Attend weekly Youth Board meetings and supervise team building and leadership development activities
- Develop and implement a College Access Series for youth to attend during the academic year
- Implement evaluations and report on the success and challenges of QYB and QYR as well the programmatic impact and recommendations for future improvement
- > Continue to formalize program evaluations to better inform program planning and accurately assess youth demographic
- > Support the YSC in planning "collaboration days", opportunities for youth to learn about other organizations in the community
- Organize "development days", events & activities for youth to learn or refine their workforce readiness skills
- > Co-lead "Bubble Tea Time" a workshop series that provides a safe space for youth to focus on their own socio-emotional development
- > Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training throughout the Commonwealth
