AmeriCorps Massachusetts Promise Fellows deliver the resources young people need to be successful in life by creating, managing, and leading meaningful out-of-school time programs for youth in grades 6-12. Fellow projects focus on mentoring, social and emotional learning, college and career readiness, academic enrichment, and community service-learning.

The Massachusetts Promise Fellowship achieves this by placing AmeriCorps Fellows with schools, non-profit organizations and state/local government agencies that focus on fulfilling the needs of our youth by providing: *a caring adult, a safe place, a healthy start, a marketable skill, and an opportunity to give back.*

SERVICE DESCRIPTION The Garden Education Fellow will work directly and consistently with members of YouthGROW, an urban agriculture and youth employment program that serves 34 low-income teens ages 14 through high school graduation. The Fellow will be responsible for all academic engagement programming, particularly college access, for members of the YouthGROW program. The Fellow will also be responsible for supporting a network of 25 educational gardens in our school gardens network to ensure school gardens are integrated into the curriculum. The Fellow will assimilate these two projects by continuing and enhancing program elements that allow current YouthGROWers to support gardens at their schools, train youth to deliver in-class educational workshops on gardening, and create a sense of student ownership and expertise over gardens in Worcester.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training throughout the Commonwealth
- Make a full-time, 12 month commitment
- Work directly with high school juniors and seniors in YouthGROW to provide college tours, application assistance, and connect them to resources around financial aid and scholarship
- Work regularly with all youth to complete community service requirements, support the agriculture production on our youth farms, and co-plan monthly workshops in collaboration with the program coordinator
- Serve as the primary point of contact between the faculty and staff at our school gardens and the REC
- Conduct site visits, provide technical support to the gardens, and offer educational programming through in-class activities and professional development focused on incorporating the gardens into curriculum
- Work closely with current YouthGROWers to develop mutually beneficial partnerships between the schools and YouthGROW program
