Massachusetts Promise Fellows deliver the resources that young people need to be successful in life by **mobilizing** and **organizing** community activity, **creating** and **leading** powerful initiatives, and **training** and **inspiring** citizen volunteers.

The **Massachusetts Promise Fellowship** achieves this by placing Fellows with non-profit organizations and state/local government agencies that focus on fulfilling the needs of our youth by providing; *a caring adult, a safe place, a healthy start, a marketable skill, and an opportunity to give back.*

SERVICE DESCRIPTION

The mission of **Big Sister Association of Greater Boston** is to help girls realize their full potential by providing them with positive mentoring relationships with women. We are the largest and oldest mentoring organization in Greater Boston that exclusively serves girls. In 2008, we served more than 3,100 girls. Our three mentoring programs include 1) Community-Based Mentoring, 2) School-Based Mentoring, and 3) Group Mentoring. The Fellow at Big Sister Association of Greater Boston will focus on volunteer recruitment and retention through 3 capacity building projects: University Partnership Development, Developing an Alumnae Association, and Increasing Diversity of Volunteers. The Fellow will manage projects directly in response to the 64% increase in Little Sister Applications in the first quarter of 2009. The Fellow will have a direct role in meeting this need.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- Coordinate and staff off-site recruitment events at colleges and universities and community organizations
- Follow up with potential Big Sisters by email and phone to enroll them into the program
- Develop formalized partnerships with Northeastern University, Simmons College, Boston University, and Berklee School of Music
- Develop updated recruitment policies and procedures for engaging and sustaining institutional partners
- Develop an Alumnae Association Board by outreaching to former Big and Little Sisters
- Support events and activities planned by the Alumnae Association
- Plan and help facilitate Diversity Council meetings (a group of 20 individuals committed to increasing the diversity of Big Sisters)
- Coordinate outreach to potential new Diversity Council members
- Provide administrative support to the events and workshops the Diversity Council plans
- Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training
