SERVICE DESCRIPTION

Boston Partners in Education, Inc. (Boston Partners) enhances the academic achievement and nurtures the personal growth of Boston's public school students by providing them with focused, individualized in-school volunteer support. For over 40 years, we have recruited, trained, placed, and supported volunteers of all ages, races, and ethnicities to work with Boston Public School students in grades K-12 during the school day in the subjects of math and English Language Arts. Our community and corporate volunteers, known as academic mentors, have touched the lives of thousands of BPS students, making a positive impact on their academic and personal development. The Fellow at Boston Partners will expand the Math Initiative. The Math Initiative matches pairs of 3rd – 5th grade students in six Boston Public Schools with trained adult academic mentors to build fundamental math skills and inspire a love of the subject. The Fellow will lead the expansion of the Math Initiative into three new schools.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- Create web-based resources for Math Initiative volunteers
- Review current Math Initiative volunteer management procedures
- Make recommendations based on above
- Start up the Math Initiative in the 3 expansion schools
- Act as primary contact for 3 expansion schools and volunteers
- Match mentors with students in 3 expansion schools
- Manage volunteer relationships for 3 expansion schools
- Assist Program Manager in writing mid-year and end-of-year program reports
- Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training
