



## Asian Community Development Corporation AmeriCorps Massachusetts Promise Fellow

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AmeriCorps Massachusetts Promise Fellows deliver the resources young people need to be successful in life by creating, managing, and leading meaningful out-of-school time programs for youth in grades 6-12. Fellow projects focus on mentoring, social and emotional learning, college and career readiness, academic enrichment, and community service-learning.

**The Massachusetts Promise Fellowship** achieves this by placing AmeriCorps Fellows with schools, non-profit organizations and state/local government agencies that focus on fulfilling the needs of our youth by providing: *a caring adult, a safe place, a healthy start, a marketable skill, and an opportunity to give back.*

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### Service Description

BOSTON & MALDEN-Asian CDC's youth leadership program, A-VOYCE, creates a pipeline of high school-aged Asian American youth who have the vision and tools to shape the physical landscape of their neighborhoods. As a part of A-VOYCE's strategic growth, A-VOYCE has launched a pilot program in Malden. The Fellow will build out this program, with a focus on community project execution and college/career readiness.

The Fellow will be responsible for building out ACDC's college and career readiness program in 3 ways:

1. Deliver a marketable skills curricula that equips 15-20 youth
2. Support new and returning youth in applying and practicing learned marketable skills by executing community projects
3. Build out existing college access initiatives including "SOUL College Readiness Retreat," match savings program, and college tours/panels

In addition to programming, the Fellow will act as a supportive adult and develop relationships with the 15-20 youth.

### Essential Responsibilities

- Develop a 35-week program that equips youth with project management and team management skills
- Create and deliver marketable skills curriculum that will be applied through community projects
- Recruit 8-10 high school youth (ages 14-18) through school visits, flyers, soliciting
- Coordinate guest workshops that aim to increase financial literacy and college preparedness
- Support match savings initiative by nominating Juniors and providing monthly check-in's to assess savings progress and identify areas of need for training and support
- Establish new and deepen existing partnerships with schools, university offices, local community programs, and business professionals
- Record all curricula and planning to ensure program sustainability and growth

- Work with Chinatown-based Youth Programs Manager to reinforce A-VOYCE values and ensure inclusive, caring program culture across A-VOYCE sites
- Support Chinatown-based team in breaking down silos among young through bonding events and collaborative workshops
- Work with Youth Programs Manager to track and measure quarterly year goals
- Supervise youth leaders off-site during occasional weekend or evening workshops/projects
- Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training throughout the Commonwealth
- Make a full-time, 11 month commitment

### Qualifications

- Ability to work independently and take initiative while also promoting collaborative team culture
- Creativity to experiment and make calculated risks while piloting program structure
- Desire to work with immigrant and first-generation college students
- Demonstrated commitment to teamwork and shared success
- Ability to track success goals and measurements
- Ability to prioritize tasks and maintain progress on short and long-term goals
- Knowledge of Asian American issues and identity development
- Deep value of and ability to create habits of empathy, integrity, and authenticity
- Ability to work independently and take initiative
- Excellent organizational and communication skills
- Deep belief in the power and potential of young people to create social change
- Experience working with youth
- Passionate about social justice and working with diverse communities
- Must be a US Citizen, US National or Permanent Resident Alien
- Must be willing to undergo a National Service Criminal History Check, including screenings through the National Sex Offender Public Website, a name-based search of the statewide criminal history registry both in Massachusetts and your state of residence upon application to our program (if not Massachusetts), and a fingerprint based FBI check. \*Eligibility to participate in MPF is contingent on the results of this screening
