AmeriCorps Massachusetts Promise Fellows deliver the resources young people need to be successful in life by creating, managing, and leading meaningful out-of-school time programs for youth in grades 6-12. Fellow projects focus on mentoring, social and emotional learning, college and career readiness, academic enrichment, and community service-learning.

The Massachusetts Promise Fellowship achieves this by placing AmeriCorps Fellows with schools, non-profit organizations and state/local government agencies that focus on fulfilling the needs of our youth by providing: *a caring adult, a safe place, a healthy start, a marketable skill, and an opportunity to give back.*

Service Description

BOSTON-Breakthrough Greater Boston's (BTGB) mission is to prepare low-income students for success in college and train the next generation of urban teachers using its unique Students Teaching Students model. To accomplish this goal, BTGB provides year-round academic and college access supports to 7th-12th grade students. The Massachusetts Promise Fellow will contribute to BTGB's mission by supporting students' academic achievement at our Dorchester campus through volunteer recruitment as well as direct engagement with a cohort of 15-20 students. The Fellow's direct service will consist of one-on-one academic mentoring and small group academic support during BTGB's middle school After School Program and high school Study Hall Program. In addition, the Fellow will oversee the coordination of enrichment opportunities for high school students.

Essential Responsibilities

- Develop and lead the implementation of a volunteer recruitment strategy for the Academic Mentor program that will include:
 - Identifying potential volunteer sources
 - Conducting outreach to build partnerships
 - Facilitating volunteer recruitment, intake, and training
 - Refining sustainable systems and documenting strategies for future years
- Work with a cohort of 15-20 students involved in BTGB's six-year academic program on a weekly basis. Activities will include one-on-one tutoring, small group academic support and homework assistance, and facilitation of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics (STEAM) and study skills workshops
- Coordinate BTGB's Study Hall Program for 9th and 10th grade students
- Research and coordinate academic, college, and career-related enrichment opportunities
- Collaborate with team members to collect and analyze academic data for students grades 7-12
- Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training throughout the Commonwealth
- Make a full-time, 11 month commitment
