AmeriCorps Massachusetts Promise Fellows deliver the resources young people need to be successful in life by creating, managing, and leading meaningful out-of-school time programs for youth in grades 6-12. Fellow projects focus on and college and career exploration and academic enrichment.

The Massachusetts Promise Fellowship achieves this by placing AmeriCorps Fellows with schools, non-profit organizations and state/local government agencies that focus on fulfilling the needs of our youth by providing: *a caring adult, a safe place, a healthy start, a marketable skill, and an opportunity to give back.*

Service Description:

Enroot is a community-based nonprofit with a mission to empower immigrant youth to achieve academic, career, and personal success through inspiring out-of-school experiences. Enroot seeks a Massachusetts Promise Fellow to provide academic enrichment support to our most recently arrived immigrant youth in Cambridge by leading Enroot's Explore & Emerge Program Cohorts. The Explore & Emerge Fellow will lead weekly mentoring nights and design a mentoring curriculum to support students in their journey to English proficiency and building a sense of belonging in their new communities. The Fellow will work closely with the Enroot staff to collaborate with teachers, guidance counselors, and volunteers to ensure students receive appropriate support, guidance, and resources.

Essential Responsibilities:

- Recruit and onboard 35-40 Cambridge Rindge and Latin students to Enroot
- Support recruitment, onboarding, and training of 60 volunteers
- Lead the mentoring program component of the Explore and Emerge cohorts (35 student-mentor matches), including supervision on mentoring nights and ongoing mentor support
- Plan educational field trips for students and mentor-mentee outings
- Providing advising and academic support to Explore and Emerge cohorts at CRLS High School
- Complete program evaluation requirements including but not limited to preparing monthly reports, a youth attendance tracker, and time sheets
- Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training throughout the Commonwealth

Qualifications:

- Passion for working with diverse youth and families and the ability to work with people from a variety of backgrounds
- Experience working with high school students and/or English Learners
- Flexibility, patience, and a good sense of humor
- Fluency/proficiency in one or more of the following languages strongly preferred: Haitian Creole, Spanish, Portuguese, French, Bengali, Hindi, or Arabic
- Proficiency with Microsoft and Google Drive applications; Salesforce experience a plus
- Must be a US Citizen, US National or Permanent Resident Alien
- Must be willing to undergo a National Service Criminal History Check, including screenings through the National Sex Offender Public Website, a name-based search of the statewide criminal history registry both in Massachusetts and your state of residence upon application to our program (if not Massachusetts), and a fingerprint based FBI check. *Eligibility to participate in MPF is contingent on the results of this screening
