AmeriCorps Massachusetts Promise Fellows deliver the resources young people need to be successful in life by creating, managing, and leading meaningful out-of-school time programs for youth in grades 6-12. Fellow projects focus on and college and career exploration and academic enrichment.

The Massachusetts Promise Fellowship achieves this by placing AmeriCorps Fellows with schools, non-profit organizations and state/local government agencies that focus on fulfilling the needs of our youth by providing: *a caring adult, a safe place, a healthy start, a marketable skill, and an opportunity to give back.*

Service Description

Brockton-The Mission of the Old Colony Y (OCY) is to put Judeo-Christian principles into practice through programs that build a healthy spirit, mind, and body for all. We seek to strengthen our communities through youth development, healthy living, and social responsibility. OCY Mentoring, part of our social services, is dedicated to providing youth with professionally supported mentoring relationships that foster healthy self-concepts and encourage positive decision making skills. The **Youth Enrichment Fellow** will increase our capacity to support youth in career and college exploration through a Fellow-designed curriculum and 1:1 meetings, while also integrating “youth voice” into all efforts.

Essential Responsibilities

- Research best practices for college and career exploration curriculum for Grades 9-12
- Research best practices and speakers to support curriculum through a social justice lens
- Create a targeted weekly curriculum that includes measurable goals and timeline for college/career exploration
- Coordinate and travel to youth engagement opportunities with partners (local colleges, agencies, and events)
- Maintain a cohort of 25-30 Youth Leaders and meet with them weekly to support them in their future goals for college/career exploration as well as social justice exploration
- Engage in the community through OCY and Brockton’s Promise and other networks to create new partnerships that provide Youth Leaders access to resources and opportunities to enhance career readiness skills
- Assist with maintaining accurate records regarding contacts and files for youth, volunteers, and families
- Provide support to the OCY team as it relates to college and career activities for youth in various OCY programs
- Complete required MPF data and evaluation requirements
- Travel at least once/month for Fellowship meetings, retreats, and training throughout the Commonwealth
- Make a full-time, 11 month commitment

Qualifications

- Excellent critical thinking and problem solving skills
- Interest in and commitment to national and community service
- Ability to prioritize tasks and maintain progress on short and long-term goals
- The ability to work independently and as part of a team, and with diverse constituencies
- Professional, mature, flexibility, and a good sense of humor
- BA/BS strongly preferred
